SUBJECT: Agreement for Extending Red Light Photo Enforcement Services

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council adopt the next resolution, in order, to approve the proposed Agreement for Red Light Photo Enforcement Services with Redflex Traffic Systems, Inc., extending services for an additional five (5) years.

BACKGROUND: Since 1996, the City of El Cajon ("City") has been successfully operating a red light photo enforcement program. On November 13, 2001, the City Council considered proposals for the continuation of its photo enforcement program in the City. On January 8, 2002, the City Council awarded a contract for red light photo enforcement services to Redflex Traffic Systems, Inc. ("Redflex") to perform installation and support of a red light photo enforcement program for the enforcement of red light traffic violations at intersections within the City. On February 7, 2002, an agreement between the City and Redflex for the above-mentioned services (the "Former Agreement") was executed by the City Manager.

Since the initial execution of the Former Agreement, the City Council authorized the City Manager to execute three amendments. The first amendment was executed on June 25, 2004 for the purposes of extending the term of the Former Agreement and to ensure it complied with the terms of California Vehicle Code section 21455.5, as amended by AB 1022. The second amendment was executed on November 7, 2005 to revise the compensation paid to Redflex for its services provided to the City. The final amendment was executed on March 6, 2007 to extend the expiration date of the Former Agreement to June 24, 2009.

The Former Agreement with Redflex expired on June 24, 2009. The City and Redflex have continued to operate under the terms of the Former Agreement during the interim period.


It is proposed that the parties agree to enter into a new agreement in order to continue the relationship between the City and Redflex. The term for the

agreement ("Proposed Agreement") between the City and Redflex will be for an additional five (5) years. The City met with Redflex and after negotiations the new contract will reflect a reduction in the monthly payments for each approach from the existing \$5,370 to \$4,300 per existing approach. In addition, Redflex will continue to provide support for two of the existing 9 approaches at no cost to the City. These two approaches are at Broadway and Mollison and Washington at El Cajon Blvd. These locations have not been providing sufficient revenue to offset the monthly fee and therefore rather than remove the cameras, Redflex agreed to leave the systems in operation without charge to the City.

The Proposed Agreement also provides that any additional approaches installed by Redflex, at the City's request, will be compensated at the rate of \$6,200 each. Neither the Police Department nor the Public Works Department believes that any additional approaches are warranted in the foreseeable future.

FISCAL IMPACT: Under the proposed new contract, the projected cost savings for the next fiscal year as well as subsequent years would be approximately \$89,880 per year and \$449,400 for the life of the contract.

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON APPROVING
AGREEMENT FOR RED LIGHT PHOTO ENFORCEMENT SERVICES**

WHEREAS, the City of El Cajon has been successfully operating a red light photo enforcement program since 1996; and

WHEREAS, from January 8, 2002 through June 24, 2009 the City of El Cajon has had an agreement with Redflex Traffic Systems Inc. ("Redflex") for the installation and support of a red light photo enforcement program at intersections within the City; and

WHEREAS, since the expiration of the agreement the City and Reflex have continued to operate under the terms of the former agreement during the interim period; and

WHEREAS, the City of El Cajon wishes to enter into a new agreement in order to continue to operate the red light photo enforcement program; and

WHEREAS, Redflex is willing to enter into a new agreement in order to continue to operate the red light photo enforcement program, at a reduced rate but for a period of five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, Purchasing, in concurrence with the Deputy City Manager/Director of Public Works and the Chief of Police, recommends extending the prior agreement with Redflex for a period of five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes it to be in the best interests of the City to award the agreement to Redflex.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council hereby approves the Agreement for Red Light Photo Enforcement Services substantially in the form as presented to the City Council at this meeting.

2. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Agreement for Red Light Photo Enforcement Services, in such form as approved by the City Manager, on behalf of the City of El Cajon.
