

LA Red Light Cameras

Confused? Here's the facts.

In case you aren't up to speed with what's going on in Los Angeles, we'll fill you in. The LA Police Commission voted unanimously to end the red-light camera program in July, 2011 because the city wasn't making as much money as expected. Bummer, right?

Furthermore, it's the city of Los Angeles, *not county*, who has dumped their cameras. Surrounding cities in LA County are still regularly issuing thousands of tickets such as Beverly Hills, Hawthorne, Commerce, Culver City, West Hollywood, Montebello, Pasadena, Bell Gardens, Cerritos, Covina, Gardena, Glendale, Glendora, Lancaster, Santa Clarita, South Gate, Walnut, and West Hollywood ... just to name a few. Woo-hoo.

How does all of this affect MY red-light camera ticket?

If you chose to ignore your red-light camera ticket, you may be subject to civil assessment (late) fees which normally are about \$300 a pop, on top of the \$500 ticket fine. Then you would be dealing with an unpaid ticket in the court's record, and if you ever got pulled over again, you'd be in big trouble. Whoops! Should've called TicketKick. It does not eliminate penalties associated with red-light citations. It does not constitute grounds for a refund of any money paid on such a citation. Anyone issued a red-light citation must resolve it within the specified time limits or face certain penalties as prescribed by law.”
