Gimbel Foundation, a component fund from The Community Foundation in the amount of \$25,000 which is to be used for the Storymobile "On the Road Again" program and increase revenues in the amount of \$25,000 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account as established by the Finance Department; (2) acceptance of gift from the Riverside Public Library Foundation in the amount of \$1,754.87 which is designated for any use at the Casa Blanca Library and; increase revenues in the amount of \$1,754.87 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account established by the Finance Department; (3) acceptance of gift from the Riverside Public Library Foundation in the amount of \$381.78 which is to be used for children's books at the Orange Terrace Library and increase revenues in the amount of \$381.78 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account established by the Finance Department; (4) acceptance of gift from the Riverside Public Library Foundation in the amount of \$4.891.53 which represents a one-time payment from the estate of Della May Majocchi which is to be used for books and children's services and increase revenues in the amount of \$4,891.53 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account established by the Finance Department; (5) acceptance of gift from the Riverside Public Library Foundation in the amount of \$4,031 which represents the 2012 distribution from the Community Foundation for the John and Mary Venderzyl "Funding the Future for Children's Services at the Riverside Public Library" and increase revenues in the amount of \$4,031 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account established by the Finance Department; (6) acceptance of gifts from the Friends of the Riverside Public Library in the amount of \$38,500 which is to be used to support various library programs and services system-wide, including \$1,000 specifically designated towards California Reads activities and increase revenues in the amount of \$38,500 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account established by the Finance Department; and (7) an increase in the grant amount from the California Council for the Humanities in the amount of \$2,000 which is to be used for printing materials and book purchases and increase revenues in the amount of \$2,000 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to the grant project Account 9862800-426800.

SEIZING OUR DESTINY - ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council authorized (1) acceptance of grant funds from the California Literacy Grant in the amount of \$12.270 to be used to recruit and train literacy

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volunteers for the Adult Literacy Program and to increase revenues in the amount of \$12,270 and appropriate expenditures in the same amount to an account as established by the Finance Department; and (2) the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all necessary documents.

#### METROPOLITAN MUSEUM BOARD RESIGNATION

The City Council approved the recommendation of Mayor Loveridge to (1) accept the resignation of Richard Hanks, Ward 2, from the Metropolitan Museum Board; (2) request the City Clerk to process the vacancy; and (3) request the Mayor send a letter thanking Mr. Hanks for the time invested serving on the Metropolitan Museum Board.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER The City Council (1) approved the Memorandum of Understanding with Riverside County Superintendent of Schools outlining terms and conditions for the School Resource Officer Program through June 30, 2013; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the necessary documents.

#### BID 7104 - POLICE UNIFORMS AND ACCESSORIES

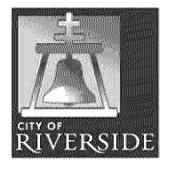
The City Council awarded Bid 7104 to Galls, LLC, Riverside, for \$74,000 for the purchase of Police uniforms and accessories through June 2013.

## CONTRACT AMENDMENT - SHARING HOUSEHOLDS ASSIST RIVERSIDE'S ENERGY PROGRAM

The City Council (1) approved a twelfth amendment to Sharing Households Assist Riverside's Energy Program (SHARE) contract with Community Action Partnership of Riverside County to extend the SHARE program in the amount of \$1.9 million; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to approve payments up to 25 percent, or \$475,000, above the SHARE contract amount if allocated funds are depleted before the contract term ends.

#### 1-HOUR PARKING ZONE - RIDGE ROAD - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution to establish a "1-Hour Parking Between the Hours of 4:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on Wednesdays and 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Sundays" zone on the north side of Ridge Road from Fairmount Boulevard to 240-feet easterly thereof; and (2) authorized and directed the Traffic Engineer to revise the specific pages of the Master Parking Schedule necessary to incorporate the amendment and distribute the revised pages to the appropriate personnel with directions to delete the original pages and insert the revised pages in the appropriate tables; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived. PREFERENTIAL PARKING ZONES - MOUNT RUBIDOUX - CONTINUED This item was continued to next week.

#### PREFERENTIAL PARKING ZONE - GLENWOOD - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution to establish a "No Parking Any Time, except for residents with permits" zone on the south side of Glenwood Drive from San Andreas Avenue to the westerly terminus; and (2) authorized and directed the Traffic Engineer to revise the specific pages of the Master Parking Schedule necessary to incorporate the amendment and distribute the revised pages to the appropriate personnel with directions to delete the original pages and insert the revised pages in the appropriate tables; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 22459 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Resolution No. 22451 Known as the Master Parking Schedule Resolution to Establish a No Parking at any Time Zone with Preferential Permit Parking for Residents on the South Side of Glenwood Drive from San Andreas Avenue to the Westerly Terminus, was presented and adopted.

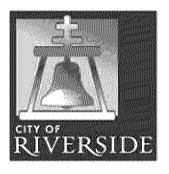
REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT - QUIET ZONE SIGNAL DESIGN
