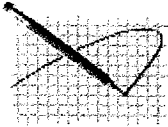

Subject Yellow timing and prevailing speed


Not sure if this is you, but you're a good starting point. :)

As part of the red light camera permit application for Sut-20 and Plumas St in Yuba City, I looked at the roadway prevailing speed. Sut-20 is posted at 35 mph, but the 85% for EB traffic is 39 mph, and 41 mph for WB traffic. The yellow timing is 3.6 seconds, suitable for 35 mph. Should we increase the yellow time to 3.9 to match 40 mph, which is closer to the prevailing speed?
